
Towel Holder

Pattern by Karen JCrochets

Make it, Sell it, Give Karen J the credit!



Materials
H Hook
Any worsted weight yarn
Scissors
Button, I" or larger
Needle
Thread

<u>Abbreviations</u>

Ch: Chain

Hdc: Half double crochet

Sc: Single crochet St(s): Stitch(es) Sl st: Slip stitch

Pattern

To Start: Ch 5, Hdc in 2nd chain from the hook & across (4)

Row I: Ch I, turn 2 hdc in first st, hdc in next 2 sts, 2 Hdc in next st. (6)

Row 2: Ch I, turn Hdc in next 2 sts, ch 2, sk next 2 sts, hdc in next 2 sts. (6) {This row is creating a button hole.}

Row 3: Ch I, turn 2 hdc in first st, 3 hdc in ch 2 space, hdc in next st, 2 hdc in next st. (8)

Row 4: Ch I, turn. Hdc in each st across. (8)

Row 5: Ch I, turn 2 hdc in next st, hdc in next 6 sts, 2 hdc in next st. (10)

Row 6: Ch I, turn. Hdc in each st across. (10)

Row 7-20: Repeat row 6.

Do not fasten off!

Now we will begin to create the loop the towel rests in:

Ch 18, sl st into last st opposite the end you chained from.

Ch I, turn Sc back into each of the 18 chains you just made.

Turn your work on its side.

You are going to put a sc in each stitch around the perimeter of the piece, including each stitch of the ch l8. Put 2 sc in each corner.

Once you have sc in each st all the way around your work, place a sl st in the very first sc you made.

Fasten off & weave in ends.

Fold the narrow end of your piece over your oven bar (or where ever you plan on using it) to determine where you need to place your button. Sew button firmly into place with needle & thread Enjoy!
